



# Kornel Makuszyński


## 1884 - 1953



Kornel Makuszyński (Friend of the coat of arms) was born on January 8, 1884 in Stryj. He was the son of Edward Makuszyński and Julia née Ogonowska. When he was 14, he wrote his first poems, the first of which the reviewer was Leopold Staff. The poems were published in the Lviv daily 'Słowo Polskie'. In 1904 Makuszyński became the member of the editorial office of this journal.

He received the membership of Polish Academy of Literature for his work as well as the state literary award PAL 'Złoty Wawrzyń'. In 1945 he was banned from publishing. He died on July 31, 1953 in Zakopane. His body is buried at the Cemetery of Merit in Pęksowy Brzyzek in Zakopane.



# Students of grades IV-VIII

There are a lot of changes in a student's life with the beginning of the fourth grade. Among other things, there are new school subjects, and most of them are guided by a different teacher. The class teacher, who meets with students at the educational hour once a week, also changes. This is the subject when the class determines the Class Three, talks on various topics, including behaviour, school environment, opportunities and threats faced by young people today. It is worth adding that each student takes the eighth-grade exam at the end of the eighth grade.



# Students of grades IV-VIII

At the end of eighth grade, each student takes an exam.

The eighth-grade exam is compulsory, which means that every student must take it to finish school. There is no minimum score specified, which a student should obtain, therefore the eighth-grade exam cannot be not passed.

The eighth-grade exam is carried out in writing.

**In the years 2019–2022**, each eighth grader takes the exam in three compulsory subjects i.e.:

- Polish
- Mathematics
- A modern foreign language.

**From 2023**, each eighth grader will take the exam in four compulsory subjects, i.e.:

- Polish
- Mathematics
- A modern foreign language
- One of the following subjects: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Geography or History

If you are a student who is just starting his adventure in a Polish school or you have returned to the country after a long absence in it, this information is especially for you.



# Students of grades IV-VIII


In our school, teaching Polish to students returning from abroad, and also to foreign students is conducted by teachers:

# Textbooks, exercises and notebooks

At the beginning of the school year students in grades I - VIII receive sets of books for the class, which they start.

Textbooks are lent to them for the period of a school year.

At the end of it, before the summer holidays, students must give the textbooks back to the library. Exercises, on the other hand, remain the property of the children.

The type of notebooks for each subject is determined by the teachers.

They also inform about any other necessary school objects during the first lesson.



# Assessment rules



**In grades I-III**, descriptive grading is used. Additionally, the terms **D-A** are introduced complementarily, where **A** is the best mastery of the material.

**In grades IV-VIII**, summative assessment is required for various subjects. Students receive grades on a scale of 1-6 at the end of the first term as well as of the second term, where the grade 6 (excellent) is the highest grade.

Subject Assessment Systems regulate the detailed assessment criteria for individual subjects. They are in line with the school's statute.

Teachers introduce their students to them at the first lesson of the new school year.
